Crittenton agencies provide a comprehensive mix of gender and culturally responsive, trauma informed and specific, developmentally appropriate, strength-based services to girls and young women who are survivors of multiple forms of adverse childhood experiences and violence.

Jeannette is currently; Chair of the National Foster Care Coalition; the co-Director of the National Girls Initiative – Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, U. S. Department of Justice. Additionally, she is a member of: the Advisory Committee of the Human Rights Project for Girls, the Advisory Committee for Women's Services – SAMHSA (Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Advisory Committee of *Family Story*, and the Advisory Board for the hope and grace fund.
